# RESEARCH ROUND-UP



## MOCA-Funded Research Helps Lead to Early Detection Clinical Trial

MOCA is a proud supporter of research that has led to the MicroRNA Detection Study (MiDE) to develop a clinical diagnostic test for the detection of early onset ovarian cancer. The study is being led by MOCA-funded researcher Dr. Kevin Elias at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. MOCA provided two years of funding to Dr. Elias for previous research which led to the MiDE trial.

The MiDE trial is open to high-risk adults throughout the U.S. with a family history of ovarian cancer or a known genetic mutation such as BRCA1, BRCA2 and others. Participants can expect to provide up to four tubes of blood every six months for up to five years. Researchers hope to detect specific biomarkers in the blood that indicate the presence of early asymptomatic cancers in the ovaries and fallopian tubes.

# National Ovarian Cancer Patient and Caregiver Preferences Study

Ovarian cancer patients and caregivers are invited to share their voices and contribute to a national study aimed at improving patient care. Participants will share their views about the impact of ovarian cancer and their preferences for different ways of taking medication.

The study is being conducted by Global Perspectives. The research hopes to identify areas for improvement in supporting patients with ovarian cancer and their caregivers after surgery and chemotherapy.
